OUR LOCAL HISTORY COLLECTION AND YOU

Chrys Meader will bring along a selection of pictures, files and index cards that form part of the local history collection and show you how you can make use of them.

Heritage covers a wide variety of environmental issues. At our second meeting on April 28, Susan Hoppe informed us that the Heritage Society of NSW not only classifies buildings but many other aspects of our habitat:plants, trees, ruins, old mines, and even shipwrecks.

### INFORMATION SOURCES

- Why not pay a visit to the Heritage Society Library at 5th Floor, Remington Centre, 169 Liverpool Street, Sydney. There are an extensive range of free plans and individual guides which cover many aspects of home renovation. The Stanton Library, Willer Street, North Sydney is also a useful source.

-Also the Heritage Council has published a book which provides information about colour schemes, suggestions for appropriate plants, and many aspects related to renovating a Federation house (the most popular style of house built during the period 1895-1920). The book is entitled, "Conservation of Federation Houses" and can be purchased from the Heritage Society for \$6.

TOOTHILL STREET, LEWISHAM

Toothill Street acquires it's name because the Toot Hill was the point where the huntsman sounded his horn! Prominent citizen, Dr Wardell stocked his estate with deer so that the local gentry could enjoy regulat hunting parties. It's also said, though not verified, that some of the older houses of Petersham-Lewisham have a small turret room above the roof so that citizens on the hills could follow the progress of the hunt. The deer in the National Park are descendents from Dr Wardell's original stock!




Did you know that the Railway bridge, crossing Hawthorne Canal, at Lewisham is a very rare structure. It's one of only two examples in the state of a Whipple Truss bridge. Built in 1885/6 to replace the original stone arch viaduct, the Whipple Truss demonstrated that colonial engineers could build what was then a very technologically advanced structure. It's been classified by the Heritage Society of NSWand it's story has been written by engineer, Don Fraser. A copy of this interesting (illustrated) article, 'Two Whipple Trusses in NSW — An Engineering Heritage Case Study', is avaiable at the Central Library. Ask Chrys.
