PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The Society has enjoyed a very successful first year with membership now standing at 140. The Society, which built on the foundations of the earlier Marrickville Historical Society, is proud to draw on a diverse membership, within and outside the Municipality and including some of the families which founded our part of Sydney.


The Society has undertaken a wide range of activities: regular monthly meetings in Petersham Town Hall; quarterly evening meetings for those not free to attend on Saturday mornings; and outings to important historic houses and places of local interest, such as the Petersham graves at Rookwood. Meetings have been addressed both by Society members and by some outstanding visiting speakers, including Nick Vine Hall of the Australian Society of Genealogists and Anne Watson, a Curator from the Power House Museum. During Heritage Week the Society undertook an ambitious programme of organ concerts at Marrickville Town Hall and St Brigid's Catholic Church which added to the Society funds and gave everyone who attended a great deal of pleasure. The Society issued two publications during the year, ten issues of the 'Newsletter' and the journal, Heritage, with articles on different aspects of Marrickville's past.

The Society has involved itself in important outside activities relevant to heritage including community projects such as the Bicentennial Stall at the Marrickville Street Fair. We have also made representation to the appropriate authories about issues such as the brick paving in Juliet Street, the new signs on Stanmore Station.

The President thanked the many people within the Society who have contributed to a successful year, paying a special tribute to Secretary Chrys Meader, who was the focal point for all Society business, enquiries and research. Special thanks were also addressed to Marrickville Council and Marrickville Rotary Club.

The President appealed for continued strong participation in our second year so that we can keep alive an appreciation of all aspects of our local heritage.
