
Bicentennial on Video

NOTE: We are unable to visit Tempe House on this date as scheduled.





Lydham Hall Visit Prompts Call for Local Museum

SPEAKING PERSONALLY - GEOFF OSTLING WRITES:

The recent excursion to Lydham Hall, the house museum maintained by Rockdale Council, emphasised the lack of such a museum in the Municipality of Marrick-ville. Lydham Hall has a warm and 'homely' feeling, as though one were visiting the home of one's favourite aunt. It is difficult to realise that when Rockdale Council acquired the property 18 years ago it was an empty shell.

Furniture, china, glassware, kitchen utensils and all the items that were in use between the time the house was built in 1860 and the outbreak of the First World War, have been donated or are on loan. Not all the items on display are valuable in monetary terms, but their interest comes from the fact they illustrate life in the Rockdale Municipality in times gone by. Many of the pieces have been donated when their owners have moved into smaller accommodation or into nursing homes. In our own municipality, such items are often sent to auction, simply because older residents think no-one



able items, simply because we have nowhere to display or store them. Obviously any decision to set up a local history museum would require a great deal of voluntary work, but with Council help, it might just be possible. What do other members think of the idea?

Airport Watch Update

More than 700 people turned out for the Public Meeting organised by Marrickville Airport Watch at Marrickville Town Hall on February 21st, 1989. After a programme of speakers, a number of resolutions were passed. They were:

1. This meeting:

- (a) opposes the easing of the curfew and calls on the Federal Government to restore the 11 pm to 6 am curfew. (b) calls on the Federal Government to immediately introduce a proper system of access control to alleviate congestion at Kingsford-Smith. (c) calls on the Federal Government to reaffirm its commitment that there will be no third runway constructed at Kingsford-Smith. (d) calls on the Federal Government to start construction of Badgerys Creek Airport by June 1989 and commit funds to ensure than an International Airport, with adequate road-rail links, is operating there by 1994.
- 2. This meeting calls on the Second Sydney International Airport Support Group to organise and lead a major demonstration at Kingsford-Smith Airport within two months of the date of this public meeting.
