SATURDAY NOVEMBER 28, 10.30AM MEET AT THE CHURCH, 189 CHURCH ST, NEWTOWN


Don't miss this rare opportunity to tour St Stephens Church with Dr Joan Kerr, respected art and architecture historian and Blacket enthusiast. Dr Kerr is Associate Professor of Fine Arts, Sydney University and her knowledge of church architecture is unrivalled.

An earlier St Stephens Camperdown (1844-5) was also designed by Blacket, on land given by Governor Bligh's wife Elizabeth. It was in a nearby street and was replaced by St Stephens Newtown in 1874. An Act of Parliament had to be passed to allow a church to be built in Camperdown Cemetery. St Stephens is built in the Decorated Gothic Revival style and is considered one of Edmund Blacket's finest parish churches. However, it is in need of urgent repairs, particularly to the spire.

Our tour of church and cemetery is by courtesy of the rector, Rev Don Saines. A donation to the Spire Restoration Fund would be appreciated. Don't forget to bring lunch for the picnic after the tour.



WEDNESDAY DECEMBER 30, MEET AT 5.45PM SHARP, MAN-O-WAR STEPS, OPERA HOUSE



Sam, an architect, is a member of the Luna Park Trust, which has been entrusted to rebuild the park. Sam is also writing a book on the history of Luna Park which will be told through the words of its users and he has invited members to share their memories with him.

Sam writes, "Amongst others I have met taxi drivers who claim to have been the first to ride the Big Dipper, a family whose boat sank in the River Caves, four bathing beauties who were Sweetie in the game "Let's Duk Sweetie" and a person who claimed that the only reason to ride on the Rotor was to be able to spit on the person next to him (ie by centrifugal force). I am yet to find a married couple who met at Luna Park and particularly in the River Caves.I would be grateful if you would share your memories/anecdotes, even amateur photographs with me regardless of how trivial they may seem to you."

He writes."Here I am. on Norfolk Island where settlement came in three waves. The first was as a convict colony, and relatively benign (1788-1814). The second (1825-1856) was as a penalsettlement also, but appallingly degrading and cruel. The third settlement period began with the removal of the last convicts and the arrival of the Pitcairn Islanders, the descendents of the Bounty mutineers and their Tahitian wives." Peter has discovered a link between Norfolk and Marrickville and has promised to tell us about it at a future meeting.



STRICTLY MARRICKVILLE

Did you know that Marrickville contains the world's most famous Hills Hoist? The clothes line on the roof of the shops at the corner of Marrickville and Victoria Roads features in scenes from the award-winning Australian film Strictly Ballroom, starring Paul Mecurio and Tara Morice. A Coca-Cola sign was added for the rooftop scene, with one long shot filmed from a cherry picker parked outside the Bi-Lo supermarket opposite. Location spotters may also be interested to know that the milk bar sequences were filmed on location in Pyrmont and the dance studio was a commercial film studio in Rosebery. - David Hilyard.

DIBBLE'S WATERHOLE TO BE RESTORED

Marrickville Council has been granted \$50,000 by the State Government for the restoration of the Dibble Avenue Duck Pond. The waterhole was formerly a brickpit. It is located close to Cooks River and is home to a variety of wetlands birds. At the moment it is secured from the general public and is heavily infested with weeds. The grant will enable council to develop the environmental, aesthetic and educational values of the site for a variety of groups including local residents, school groups and birdwatchers.

It is proposed to remove weeds and replant the area appropriately, construct a floating bird nesting island, and construct a short board walk and viewing platform. After consultation with residents and interested groups, work is expected to begin in April 1993.
